





II. INTERNATIONAL WAR AND PEACE STUDIES CONGRESS LESSONS LEARNED FROM THE 21ST CENTURY WARS



AIM AND SCOPE

War, which humanity has been facing for thousands of years, has an unchanging essence that resists time and has evolving and frequently changing characteristics. The unchanging essence consists of passion and primordial violence, chance and probability, reason, and political purpose, and is defined as the "paradoxical trinity" by Clausewitz. Since war is not bound by time and space, geopolitical, political, socio-cultural, economic, technological, international, legal, and cognitive developments constantly change it.

As is evident in the interstate wars, civil conflicts, and acts of terrorism that have taken place in the 21st century from Iraq to Afghanistan, from the Middle East to Latin America, and from Africa to Europe; significant changes are being experienced in the strategic, operational, tactical, and technical levels of warfare with the widespread use of advanced technologies, especially artificial intelligence, nanotechnology and robotic studies. The level of changes that have come is much more evident in the Russia-Ukraine and Israel-Hamas conflicts, where dramatic results have emerged.

Today, leading states allocate resources to detect changes in advance and learn lessons. This practical approach allows them to adapt to change, avoid being caught unprepared for war, and gain an advantage over rivals. The lessons learned from this congress will directly apply to such work and research, ensuring that your participation will have a tangible impact and contribute to advancing war and peace studies.

In this context, Istanbul Arel University International Strategic Research Application and Research Center (Arel USAM) has organized an international congress titled "Lessons Learned from 21st Century Wars". This congress, of immense global significance, will bring together the war and peace studies community worldwide. It will be held online and face-to-face in Turkish and English, and participation is free of charge.

The congress will focus on strategic, operative, tactical, and technical level observation, detection, and lessons learned from intelligence, reconnaissance, surveillance, warning and notification systems, command-control-communication, maneuver, combat in urban areas, fire support, naval operations, air operations, air defense operations, special forces operations, logistics and personnel activities, training, artificial intelligence and robotic systems, and civil defense-public protection areas.

EXPECTED OUTPUTS FROM THE CONGRESS

- To create knowledge on current and potential doctrines and concepts within the scope of the congress themes.
- To provide information on developments in warfare weapons and vehicles, command control, intelligence, and logistics systems.
- To follow developments in asymmetric means such as CBRN systems, cyber technologies, information systems, and robotic systems and to open doors to new developments in these areas.
- To enable analysis and synthesis at technical, tactical, operative, and strategic levels.
- To provide information exchange between the Academy Security Sector Security Bureaucracy.
- To create approaches for introducing developments in demand-based warfare weapon vehicles and systems to the armed forces.
- To create approaches for introducing supply-based innovative warfare weapon vehicles and systems to the armed forces.

ABSTRACTS

Abstracts (maximum 300 words) prepared using the abstract submission template should be sent to **https://wapscon.arel.edu.tr/** by February 14, 2025, at the latest.

In presentations and full texts of abstracts, emphasis is expected to be given to developments with innovation/revolutionary potential in military issues rather than theoretical discussions and definitions.

The presentation time of abstracts during the congress should not exceed 15 minutes.

The Congress Organizing Committee will review abstract proposals through referees, and the applicant will be informed as necessary. Abstracts will be published as an e-book before the congress.

Full texts between 2500 and 4000 words should be sent as a Microsoft Word document to **https://wapscon.arel.edu.tr/** by June 9, 2025. The full-text proceedings book will be published electronically on August 9, 2025.
